What should we be doing in family worship?

Read: Psalm 119:105—Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path.

This week's passages: Call to Worship: Psalm 100

Sermon Text: 1 Corinthians 4:1-5

Benediction: Hebrews 13:20-21

Pray: Philippians 4:6-7 Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. ⁷ And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

Pray: For our local, state, and federal governments: God, help our elected officials as they allocate the necessary resources for combatting this pandemic. Help them to provide more tests.
